
Joint Action News

How your donations help

The BOA Orthopaedic Surgery Research Centre (BOSRC), based at York Trials Unit, supports the BOA in expanding the number of trials in the UK related to Trauma and Orthopaedics. The activity by the research team at York over the past year is summarised here:

Four new research studies are now underway following successful grant applications. One study, known as the OPAL study, will develop an occupational advice intervention to support early recovery to usual activities including work, for patients undergoing hip and knee replacements. The second project underway is investigating the topic of how best to manage rib fractures.

The third study will investigate whether a collagenase injection is as good as surgery at treating Dupuytren's contracture. If the injection is found to be as good as surgery it means that patients can have an alternative option to surgery. The fourth study will address the problem of knee swelling following total knee replacement, which is a common problem for patients.

The BOSRC initiative has so far secured more than £2.7million of funding for trauma and orthopaedic research.

We are also co-funding James Lind Alliance Priority Setting Partnerships (PSPs). Patients, carers and clinicians come together in PSPs to identify and prioritise the Top 10 uncertainties, or 'unanswered questions', about the effects of treatments that they agree are most important.

The aim of this is to help ensure that those who fund health research are aware of what matters to both patients and clinicians. The PSPs that currently relate to Trauma and Orthopaedics are:

- Hip and knee replacement for osteoarthritis
- Early hip and knee osteoarthritis
- Surgery for common shoulder problems
- Broken bones in older people musculoskeletal injury: fragility fracture of the lower limb and pelvis
